#### Jamestown Elementary School PTA Meeting Minutes Tues., Dec. 1, 2020 7:00 pm 21 Attended Virtually

### 1) Welcome & Administrative Matters – Shelly Heinrich

- The PTA board and school administration introduced themselves
- The meeting agenda was approved

#### 2) Buddy Benches - Caroline Bailey

• Caroline is a 10<sup>th</sup> grader at Stoneridge. For a Girl Scout Silver project, she created the idea of the Buddy Bench in 2019. Its purpose is for shy children to have a way to show others they want to be included, and give an opportunity for children to include others. One was installed in Spring 2020 on the main playground. The final two benches finally arrived after shipping delays, and Caroline built and installed them this past weekend.

### 3) **Principal's Report** – Michelle McCarthy

- APS has begun a "No place for hate" initiative, a framework for inclusive learning for all. The school counselors are spearheading. Ms. Gaeta is looking for parent volunteers to be on the No Place for Hate committee.
- There was a parent question on whether gifted student testing would occur. They are still formulating the plan for testing in the new year.
- Jamestown is again participating in the Randolph Angel Tree. A link to participate will be in the Principal's report.
- Virtual Book Fair has begun. A Books Before Bed virtual read aloud is tomorrow night.
- Library curbside pick up going well, and another date has been added.
- SCA election was successful, and Ms. Gaeta held the first virtual meeting with the officers. Representatives will be voted on from each classroom. They are already working on spirit days and other activities.
- Reminder to help support the children during virtual learning with keeping a schedule and asking for any help needed from the school counselors.

## • Internal Relations – Carrie Gray

- SEPTA chat with Superintendent is December 9 for anyone who wants to join.
- The Virtual Run Club is up and running, with applications due Friday. Thanks to Beth Taylor and Mr. Gawrys
- Thanks to Stephanie Carpenter for work with room parents on holiday gifts and party planning.
- There was a discussion on a possible virtual school play festival. The former director (Chris Wilson) has submitted a proposal for a script-writing course, with several shorter productions videoed on their own, for up to 55 students. He would edit the student videos and host a "premier" night. Funds would be used towards editing, sound and animation. In previous years, funds for the school play were raised through a participation fee and concessions, with the PTA paying approximately \$1,000. This year, there would not be concessions, and the PTA had not set aside money in the budget. Chris would charge \$5,500, which Carrie proposes the PTA pay. She expects to recoup half of those funds from participation fees.
  - Carrie moved for \$5,500 of PTA funds be allocated to the Virtual Play Festival. The motion was approved.
